Cha Kwo Ling Centre has been a government-funded Neighbourhood Level Community Development Project (NLCDP) since August 1981 that provides services to the Cha Kwo Ling Village where the provision of welfare services and facilities was inadequate, with a flexible range of welfare services to fill service gaps.

To empower and help local residents to understand and address the specific needs or issues faced by the community and to encourage residents' involvement in resolving these needs or issues; to solve problems in the community, improve the living environment and improve the quality of life for the residents.

# Target Group

Residents living in the squatter area of Cha Kwo Ling; elders living in old private buildings may apply to register as Centre's elderly membership.

## (Service methods)

According to the needs of the service, it is implemented in different forms.

Community forms: such as carnivals, community forums and etc.;

Group form: such as residents' concern group, volunteer group, interest group and welfare rights group;

Personal forms: such as family visits, personal enquiry and referral services; Outdoor activities: such as outings, visits, charity walks and etc.

#### **Scopes of Service**



Organisation Work: encourage resident to help each other so that issues in the community can be solved collectively and quality of life can be improved.

Community Groups: work as a group to satisfy the needs of individual communities and promote volunteer work in the community.

Crisis Intervention: provide support and assistance for unexpected disasters in the community, such as fire and windstorms.

Community Education: through various activities such as exhibition, talks and information counters for residents to raise their awareness of the society.

Community Services: providing appropriate services tailored to the needs of different groups:

Community Activities: provide recreational activities to satisfy the needs of different communities.

Enquiry and Referral Services: provide information and referrals to individuals and families to assist them in handling issues in their
