It provides group home living for people with disabilities who can only live semi. Independently with a fair amount of assistance from hostel staff in daily activities.

Service Target

People with disabilities who are:

- Aged 15 or above
- Capable of semi-independent living i.e. mastery of self-care skills but may need a fair amount of guidance/assistance in some domestic tasks like cooking or washing or in community living activities like shopping;
- Actively occupied in various forms of employment or day training
- Physically and mentally suitable for group living
- Physically healthy with no active infectious disease or drug/alcoholic abuse

Case Work

- The unit regularly observes and assesses service users' training and living conditions in the dormitory, and holds case meetings on schedule to provide appropriate holistic development services.

Parent Work

- Regularly hold parent meetings and home visits to encourage families to provide feedback on the services
- Organize the visits and talks to promote carers understanding on rehabilitation service and other supportive services.
- Maintain close communication with the carers, sharing with them the progress of the service users, the useful tricks and difficulties encountered in training and caring for people with disabilities, thereby promoting mutual support

Respite Service

Provide fourteen days of short-term accommodation services to relieve the pressure of carers for the mild and moderate grade service user

Home Vacation

Encourage service users to regularly return home for vacations, spending quality time with their families and enjoying the joys of family life

Staff

Includes registered Social workers, Enrolled nurses, Resident occupational therapist, Resident speech therapist, Health worker, House parent, House assistant

Application and Withdrawal from Service

- Referrals can be made by social workers and staff of rehabilitation service units to the Central Referral System for Rehabilitation Services of the SWD
- Individual service user has the right to apply for a withdrawal from the service at any time
